The University Explorations Program allows students who want to explore the educational paths that Johnson & Wales offers to pursue a program of general studies as well as introductory courses in areas of interest during their first two semesters. Students who begin their studies in the University Explorations Program may be eligible to earn a bachelor's degree at the end of four years of study.
